## Healthy Snacks

We have a healthy tuck shop which runs in school each day selling healthy snacks at a cost of 20p. It has come to our attention that some children are bringing in snacks from home which do not fall into this 'healthy snack' category and we ask that only tuck that is low in fat, salt and sugar are brought in from home.



Staff will be monitoring the playground and ensuring crisps, chocolate, fizzy pop and sweets are not being brought in from home.

With regards squash in bottles we strongly discourage juice but understand that some children refuse to drink water. To try and reach a happy compromise can we please ask that only sugar free orange squash is provided and that blackcurrant is avoided.

## PE Kits and Safety

Children wearing earrings in school during PE lessons will be expected to remove them or cover them with tape or plasters. To avoid any upset can I suggest that you check using the weekly timetable provided by staff and on the days your child is timetabled to have a PE session they do not wear jewellery of any sort.
